

Musical Research Project

Criteria:

You will be researching a favorite instrument, musician/composer, or any other musical element or genre (rock, pop, country, jazz, etc.) that may interest you.

Based on your research, you will write and type a one-page paper that features a paragraph on the biographical or historical aspect of the musician/composer, instrument, or genre.

The second paragraph should focus on famous works (songs or pieces) by the composer or musician. If you pick an instrument, name some songs or pieces where the instrument is prominently featured (solo).

The third paragraph should focus on your reasons as to why you picked the following songs or pieces by the composer, musician, or instrument you had chosen. Why are the songs or pieces so significant?

The fourth paragraph should focus on the significance and impact that the musician, composer, or instrument has made on both you and the world in general.

E.g The Beatles were such a significant band within the pop music genre because their song writing abilities and popularity had set the standard to which many modern pop band and musicians follow and aspire.

Once you complete your research, remember to cite the sources you had used (books, internet sites) on the back of the report. Include a minimum of 2 sources.

Refer to the attached bibliography guideline to ensure you cite your source correctly.

Be sure to read over the attached rubric carefully to ensure you include everything that's required.

The rough draft will be written in class and should include an eye-catching title.

The final draft is to be typed using size 14 font. Font style must be legible.

Bibliography Guidelines

1. Bibliography page should be on a separate page/slide at the end of your paper/power point.
2. Label the page Bibliography (do not italicize the words bibliography or put them in quotation marks)
3. Double space all citations, but do not skip spaces between entries.
4. Remember to use 12 pt. Times New Roman font.
5. When you write your bibliography, **list all of your references in alphabetical order by Author's last name or title if there are no authors.** Formats for each type of publication are as follows:

- **Web Site:**

Author(s) if appropriate. "Title of Article if appropriate. *"Title of Site or web page.* URL of site, date of publication (the earliest copyright year listed).

"Thomas A. Edison." *News.*

- **Book:**

Author(s). *Title of book.* Edition. Location of publisher: Name of Publisher, year of publication.
